Even Taman Negara, the world's oldest rainforest, estimated at 130 million years old can be found here.

Places of Interest


Petronas Twin Tower, KLCC

Standing at 451.9 m, the world-renowned Petronas Twin Towers is KLCC's centrepiece and one of the country's most famous icons. The Skybridge on the 41st and 42nd floor doubles up as an excellent viewing platform of the city's skyline. Featuring a futuristic glass-and-steel exterior and a traditionally inspired interior, the 88-storey building reflects Malaysia's aspirations in moving forward while maintaining its national identity and traditional values.



Petaling Street (Chinatown)

Petaling Street or Chinatown is a lively stretch of shops, restaurants and hawker stalls. It is one of the best places to enjoy the outdoor shopping experience while browsing through an assortment of things from watches, accessories, clothes, fresh fruits, flowers, crafts and souvenirs. The streets are lined by buildings, clan houses and temples which stand as testament to the city's architectural heritage.



KL Tower

Poised atop Bukit Nanas, KL Tower is a major landmark in the city. Situated in the KL Forest Eco Park and standing at 421 m, this telecommunications tower is the seventh tallest in the world and the tallest in Southeast Asia. Highlights include the 276 m Observation Deck, Sky Box situated 300m above ground and the Atmosphere 360* revolving restaurant.



Pasar Seni (Central Market)

Situated within a restored art deco façade, Central Market is famed for its variety of authentic Malaysian souvenirs. Get handicrafts, songket and batik attire, paintings, hand-made items and more. There are also DIY workshops and caricature artists. Outside, Kasturi Walk offers an alfresco shopping ambience.



Blue Pool (River of Life)

Occupying a historic location at the confluence of the Klang and Gombak Rivers, this is a new scenic waterfront in Kuala Lumpur. It attracts visitors with a dancing symphony fountain and lighting effects. The Blue Pool is situated near Masjid Jamek.



Sultan Abdul Samad Building

One of the city's most prominent and distinguished landmarks, the Sultan Abdul Samad Building is an enduring attraction amidst the rapidly changing city skyline. Built in 1897, the building was named after the reigning monarch at the time. The stately edifice served as the government administrative building during the British era. Constructed entirely of brick, it boasts a Mahometan or Neo-Saracenic style with an imposing porch, graceful arches, shiny copper domes and a 41.2 m high clock tower.
